Treaty Claim Update

Great news whanau. The Crown has given approval to Muaupoko Tribal Authority (MTA) to continue the process to gain a Crown-recognised mandate to represent Muaupoko in Treaty negotiations with the Crown for the comprehensive settlement of all Muaupoko historical Treaty of Waitangi claims. This will include a new treaty 'public consultation' process where MTA will publicise its Mandate Strategy. The Mandate Strategy outlines that the MTA will be holding an inclusive mandate process and will

hold information hui with whanau. This process will start soon.

To assist us, MTA is seeking a Project Manager for the consultation of the mandate strategy. It is a 2 month part-time contract (20hrs/week) with an immediate start. The ideal person must have proven project management experience in working in the Treaty Settlement process and funding.

MTA is about to embark on a 'whole package approach' around the iwi priority, Muaupokotanga. The Ministry of Education is committed to working collaboratively with Muaupoko on areas of shared interest.

The Ministry will support Muaupoko to engage with whanau and key stakeholders to develop an Education Strategy, Te Reo Strategy and Implementation Plans specific to the education aspirations of Muaupoko.
